MC4, under the management of the Program Executive Office for Enterprise Information Systems (PEO EIS), is comprised of joint software, commercial and Government-off-the-shelf products, and ruggedized hardware that enables health care providers to access, digitally record and transfer critical medical data from the foxhole to the field hospital and, ultimately, to US medical facilities.

Using the MC4 system, medical personnel have instantaneous access to patients’ medical histories enabling them to provide immediate medical care to wounded personnel.

Treatment and care data from the battlefield is forwarded digitally to field facilities where personnel can prepare for medical situations even before the patient arrives at the field hospital, often saving minutes which can be critical between life or death. The records follow soldiers to stateside military and civilian medical facilities and the VA, making it easier for soldiers to obtain follow-on care and benefits.

The system is used by more than 500 deployed active Army, Army Reserve and National Guard units worldwide, making it the most widely used medical information recording system on the battlefield. Approximately 22 million electronic patient encounters have been recorded in the MC4 system since being fielded in 2003.
